

In 2013, ENP finished its 6th year of existence and we began to see a real change in the work our churches and community are doing together, as we seek transformation in our city.

A Few Highlights:

- We continue to see an increase in hours volunteered in the classroom, in after-school programs and in overall presence on the school campuses.
- Our Saturday Sports Programs are no longer just two hours of fun for kids to engage with positive role models on a Saturday morning. Fitness and nutrition are now key components to the ministry and parents are more engaged.
- Kindergarten Readiness was brought into the mix as we saw a need to address early learning in a more intentional way.
- Access to healthy foods is a real concern in some of our neighborhoods and we are encouraged to see partnering teams begin to focus on this issue.
- Parent equipping is now an active part of some of our schools' visions. Deep rooted issues are being tackled in small ways that could lead to major shifts in our paths to serve a neighborhood. Because of these deeper connections to parents we are seeing them more involved on their school campuses and taking on leadership roles in their neighborhoods.

We will focus on strengthening and mobilizing our current partnership churches to grow in their relationships with kids, families and school staff and continue to search for churches who are willing to partner with schools who eagerly await the support of a local church body.

ENP is proud to be a catalyst in meshing the Church with the business sector, the public sector as well as other players in the social sector. All with a vision of seeing the Lord's people displaying His presence through their good deeds and Good News. The result is transformation of lives, families and neighborhoods within our city.

Thanks to all of you who helped make 2013 a great year and to those who will partner with us in 2014, as together we continue serving Fresno . . . one neighborhood at a time.








GROWTH IN VOLUNTEER HOURS







Parent Engagement

Great strides were made this year in our vision of encouraging and empowering parents to serve and take on a leadership roles in their neighborhoods. We have seen them step forward in a variety of ways, including: volunteering at school carnivals, hosting appreciation lunches for school staff, monitoring crosswalks and bridges for student safety, participating in community clean-up projects, teaching Kindergarten Readiness classes with moms and their children, taking on leadership roles at Saturday Sports, attending city hall meetings, and talking with council members regarding neighborhood concerns.







By connecting parents with each other, to our partnership churches and our schools, strengths are combined. We are convinced this is the path to significant growth and progress toward our vision of healthy, thriving communities.

Fresno State Interns and Volunteers

Every Neighborhood Partnership continues to build a strong relationship with Fresno State University. This past year, fourteen interns from several programs have chosen to work with ENP to fulfill their volunteer requirements. Scholars in Service is a program offered to eligible students who work 90 hours a semester with an organization that relates to their major. These students receive a financial stipend through the Jan and Bud Richter Center. Work Study is a need based program run federally through Fresno State. Students can work up 20 hours per week with an on-campus or select non-campus job. Five others students are part of Child and Family & Consumer Science and one from Recreation Administration. These students all have one thing in common. They chose to work with Every Neighborhood Partnership. They are working on the campuses, taking on leadership roles at Saturday Sports, helping in after school programs and wherever needed. ENP is grateful for their commitment and the ability to help them see the importance of churches, organizations and volunteers working together. Although these connections began as a requirement for volunteer hours, the experience has taught them a lot about themselves, our city, and the vast opportunities we all have to invest in the place we call home. During the 2012-13 school year, Fresno State students provided over one million hours of service to our community. ENP feels fortunate to be one of the many recipients of Fresno State student service!



ENP also invites Fresno State teams and academic departments to volunteer at Saturday Sports. These students not only engage in sports, fitness and nutrition activities with the children, but also bring awareness to the students and families of the importance of a college education!

Men's Alliance

Fresno Unified's Men's Alliance is a mentoring component for young men in high school and middle school. ENP was able to partner with FUSD and start 5 elementary school "Boys to Men" after-school programs. This will complete the pipeline of working with our struggling students at an early age.

The program is held in a classroom and led by volunteers from the partnering church. The kids are connecting with the volunteers, showing an improvement in overall attendance and a reduction in behavior issues. They are also learning how to engage with other students at their school in a more positive way.

We look forward to seeing this program continue to grow in several of other partnering schools next school year.

Kindergarten Readiness

A partnership with the Fresno Business Council allowed ENP to team up with ladies in several of our neighborhoods to offer kindergarten readiness classes for moms and their pre-school children. By working together, these ladies have a better understanding of what their children



as their child's first teacher and a better understanding of what their children need to know before they enter Kindergarten.




