This past year was a breakthrough year for ENP. Our initial relationship forming programs like Saturday Sports and Classroom Volunteering has led to the building of relationships that have carried our efforts deeper into the lives of the parents in our neighborhoods.

We greatly expanded our parent empowerment gatherings with weekly meetings that bring informational resources to our parents. Topics such as financial education, the new health care reform, family nutrition, job readiness program awareness, personal health and others are shared every week in 5 different neighborhoods. We see this expansion continuing this year.

On the back side of this update you will be reading about our partnerships with **Habitat for Humanity**, **The Center for Community Transformation** as well as our continued work with **Fresno State**, **Fresno Pacific and Fresno City College**.

We have also had an intentional focus on youth fitness, accessing fitness levels to about 400 youths each quarter and tracking the hours our partnerships are engaging the kids in fitness activities. At peak times of the year we have over 10,000 fitness hours per month at our programs.

Our partnerships are also making an impact on academics in the classroom. We've launched two reading intervention programs and they are showing amazing results with the effectiveness of these structured services.

Teaming with Off the Front, we have not only seen academic improvements but the kids now have the ability to ride their bikes to school, which leads to improved fitness in their lives. Included in this is a wonderful bike repair program that helps everyone keep their bikes functional and safe.

Some things to look for in 2013 are our Kindergarten Readiness Programs, our continued partnership with **First 5 Fresno County**, our work with the **Center for Community Transformation** job readiness initiative, and our ongoing service to elementary schools.





Many partnerships stepped forward in 2011 to help with clean-up projects at city parks and in the neighborhoods.








GROWTH IN VOLUNTEER HOURS

Saturday Sports




Step 2Classroom Volunteering, Mentoring, After School Programs




